We get too busy to openly and honestly communicate with our spouse. We take their love for us for granted. We take for granted that they know we love them. We may go long periods of time without expressing our love for them. We do not adequately express our appreciation for them. Children rightly require so much of our time that we do not have time for our spouse. Date nights become a thing of the past. If we are not careful, we will grow further and further from our spouse until our relationship is very weak. Little relationship termites silently grow in number and swarm doing unseen damage to our homes and our marriages. The beautiful relationship we started with becomes a sad thing of hopelessness and disagreements.

Pray that all of us will diligently and wisely exterminate the relationship termites that could be hidden negative forces in our marriage.
